1. WHAT IS A NEAR MISS?

A near miss is an unplanned event that **did not result in injury, illness, damage, or loss — but had the potential to do so.**



**NO HARM TODAY
DOESN'T MEAN
NO RISK TOMORROW.**

Near misses give us a chance to fix problems before someone gets hurt, before equipment is damaged, and before we disrupt operations.

2. EXAMPLES OF NEAR MISSES



Spill on the floor that could have caused a fall.



Damaged or loose equipment that could have caused a trip or injury.



Close call with a moving forklift.



Item nearly falling from a shelf.



Small chemical leak discovered during routine work.

3. HOW TO REPORT

1



Use your site's reporting system

2



Provide clear details about what happened and where.

3



Include photos if possible.

4



Let your supervisor know if immediate action is needed.

Reporting is Everyone's Job.

4. WHY REPORT?



Helps prevent injuries and serious incidents.



Identifies and corrects hazards early.



Builds a stronger safety culture.



Shows what's working and where we can improve.

5. REAL IMPACT

A team member reported a loose guard on a machine during a routine inspection. The guard was repaired the same day.

Two days later, a part of that guard failed. Because it was reported and fixed early, no one was injured.
